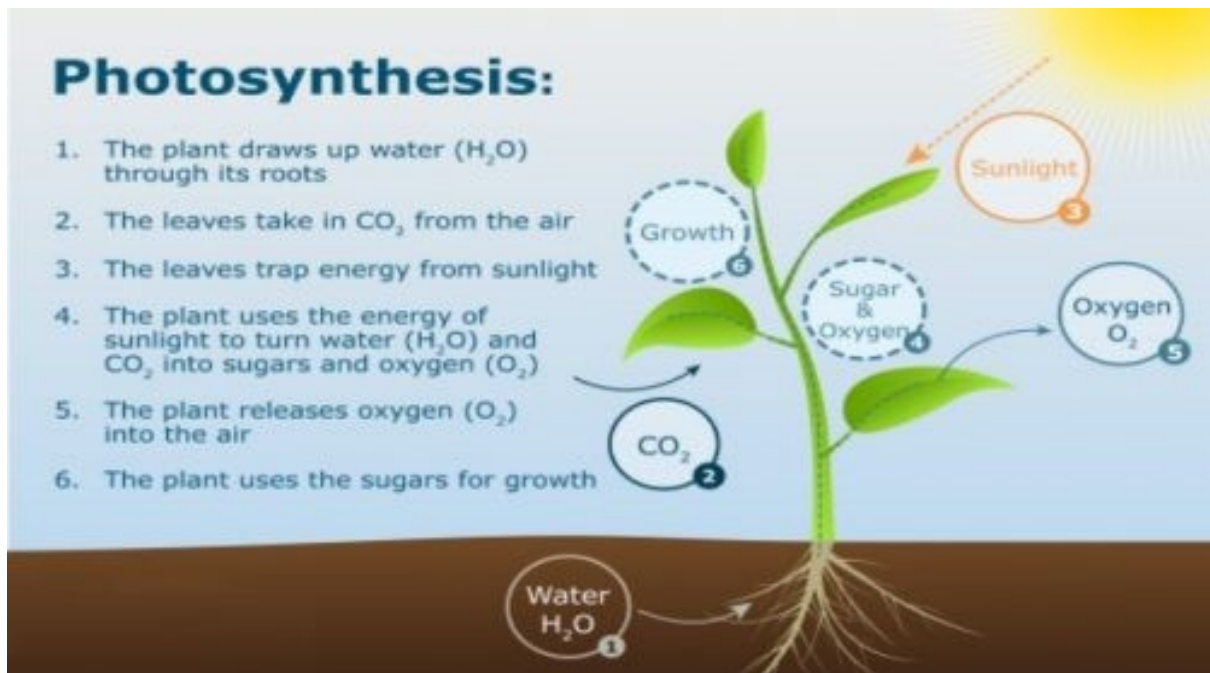


MORE ON PHOTOSYNTHESIS

Soybeans and corn are both classified as plants. Plants are called autotrophs because they can create their own food from inorganic substances!

When you are hungry, what do you do? Do you go to the kitchen and grab an apple? Maybe you open the refrigerator and find a piece of cheese. Plants don't have to go anywhere for their food! Through a chemical change process called photosynthesis, plants develop food.

PHOTOSYNTHESIS COMES FROM TWO GREEK WORDS:
PHOTO MEANING LIGHT
AND
SYNTHESIS MEANING PLACE TOGETHER



The picture above explains how plants take water (H_2O) from the soil, carbon dioxide (CO_2) from the air, and energy from sunlight to generate their own food! Then plants release oxygen (O_2) into the air. Animals, including, humans breathe oxygen. Isn't it amazing that farms not only grow plants that we eat but help produce the oxygen we breathe!
